DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I have enjoyed describing the setting of this particular performance of Julius Caesar too much over the past months:

A mythical matriarchy with the political structure of Ancient Rome the language of Renaissance England and the style of 1940's America.

The concept, like all the best concepts, grew out of necessity. Incarnate Word Academy is an all-female school, so if we are going to do Shakespeare, it will need to be gender blind or gender reversed (women play the male parts and men play the women's parts). The costume hold is also overflowing with 1940's (and thereabouts) costumes thanks to Mill Girls and Thoroughly Modern Millie but completely devoid of a single toga.

Both of these necessities have led to great things on our humble stage. I have loved hearing the soaring rhetoric of Shakespeare's greatest political play performed by the female actors of IWA. As each of our major political parties seriously considers a female presidential candidate, the visual proves hopeful rather than discouraging. Perhaps we are not far from a world where no Portia, whether male or female, feels restricted from a career in public office as she (and in our production he) so tragically does.



The setting of the 1940's allowed me not only to make use of our fabulous collection of costumes but to repurpose the flagrant propaganda of the 1940's to the Ancient Roman cause. The students who designed the posters for the show did stunning, historically-inspired work and (hopefully) learned something about the power of visual images to stir the hearts and minds of the people. The 1940's were not a subtle time, and neither was Ancient Rome under the brief dictatorship of Julius Caesar.

Shakespeare's play also provides a lesson that I believe the 1940's could have used. We have a tendency to blame one man rather than a larger corrupted society for the horrifying events of World War II. We have a tendency to believe that but for the existence of that one man, the world would never have turned to such darkness. We overlook the complicity of the malleable plebeians in favor of blaming Caesar, Brutus, or Antony. We turn away from our share in the guilt for the horrors of our own society. As the Conspirators learn to their peril, forces of history are never so simple or easily corrected. Trying to save democracy with assassination will only lead to more violence.

The students have worked incredibly hard over the last five weeks to put this production together, and I could not be more proud to have directed them. They mastered the language of Renaissance England, incorporated the history of Ancient Rome (read in translation for some of them), and created exciting artwork inspired by the 1940's. They have worked hard to make not only an old play but an elaborate concept easy for the audience to understand.

I suspect they found parts of this challenge less difficult than they originally expected. After all, the political rhetoric on both sides of our own country's elections often echoes the power – and the hysteria – of the Ancient Rome.
